Bus Expectations

We are seeing some students struggling with following the bus rules so it seems like a great time for us to remind everyone of bus expectations. Please encourage your students to be safe, respectful, and calm on the bus. In addition, we do not want the students writing notes on the bus to each other. The notes are causing students to be upset and it is making a mess on the bus. The bus drivers will be

writing tickets if the students are not following the bus expectations. Thank you for your support with keeping all of our students safe on the bus.



Mettawee Bus Safety Rules

- 1. Stay facing forward in your seat while the bus is in motion.
- 2. Use quiet voices.
- 3. Be respectful to your friends and the bus driver.
- 4. Keep hands and feet to yourself.
- 5. Stay out of the aisle and sit with your back against the seat.
- Please do not eat or drink on the bus.
- 7. Always listen to the bus driver's directions.

Winter Sports Update



We have received the winter guidance from the Agency of Education. The state strongly recommends all eligible student athletes to get vaccinated. The

memo states that unvaccinated student athletes will need to be tested weekly in order to participate in playing a winter sport. Keeping track of weekly testing for each unvaccinated student will be a lot to manage for grades K-6. Based on this, we will only be offering basketball to

Mettawee students in grades 3-6. Masks will be worn by all student athletes, coaches, referees, and spectators during indoor practices and games, regardless of individual vaccination status.



We will be starting basketball practices in January. This gives our families time to get their children vaccinated before participating in basketball. If you do not plan on getting your child vaccinated, and they want to play basketball, you will need to have your child tested each week with a PCR test. The results will be submitted each Friday in order for your child to participate in basketball practices and games the following week.

Mrs. Webb will be sending home a student sign up sheet next week to see how many students would like to participate in basketball in grades 3-6. We will also be recruiting basketball coaches. These details will be determined by mid-December. Basketball practices and games will be scheduled from January to the end of February. COVID-19 Question of the week!

Answers to some Commonly asked COVID19 Questions

* When will the COVID-19 vaccine be available to 5-11 year olds in Vermont and what will the roll out look like?

Covid-19 vaccination appointments for Vermont children ages 5 to 11 opened Wednesday morning, November 3rd, at 8:00 a.m.

Appointments for school-based and state-run clinics can be made at

healthvermont.gov/KidsVaccine or by calling 855-722-7878. Families may need to add their child as a dependent in the registration system.

We are fortunate that there will be a clinic for 5-11 year olds in Manchester with the first vaccine on November 13 and the second on December 4. The clinic is open from 9:00am-3:00pm and has 200 appointment times. If these appointments are filled, the Department of Health has said they will offer another clinic the weekends of November 20 and December 11. These clinics are only for 5-11 year old children.

The vaccine authorized for young children is a smaller, more diluted dose than the vaccine for those 12 and older, meaning only certain clinics will have the necessary supplies to administer shots to 5 to 11 year-olds. Those locations will be indicated in the registration system.

If you have questions about the vaccine, please visit the <u>Vermont Department of Health website</u>. This site is the state's primary site for providing information and many of your questions will be answered here.

#1 - STAY HOME - if

you send your child to school not feeling well (headache, stuffy nose, cough...) we WILL send them home.

#2 - If the symptom lasts for less than 24 hours
you may send them back to school the next day. We
will be happy to have them back!

#3 - If the symptoms last for more than 24 hours -

EVEN IF THEY SEEM VERY MILD AND YOU WOULD NORMALLY NOT BRING THEM TO A DOCTOR - Please schedule a covid test or a visit to your child's doctor. We do NOT want to see them back at school unless they have had a covid test or have an alternative diagnosis in writing from a doctor.

#4 - If you choose to not test - your child can return to school only after 10 full days from the onset of their symptoms.

Even if your child is feeling totally better, unless they have had a covid test, have an alternative diagnosis from a doctor, or it has been 10 days since the first day they were feeling sick, we do not want them back at school.

We are doing our very best to keep sickness out of our classrooms and to keep our school open. We thank you for your patience and cooperation.






