# COVID-19 Question of the day!

Answers to some Commonly asked COVID19 Questions

PCR Test vs. Antigen - what's the difference?



### **PCR test Pros:**

 Very accurate at detecting COVID-19 even in the early days of infection

### PCR test Cons:

- Can take a few days to a week to receive test results
- If you have recently had covid you will likely continue to test positive on a PCR test even after your infectious period

A PCR test is considered the gold standard for detecting COVID-19. The PCR can detect COVID-19 in the first days of infection. The trouble with the PCR test is that it can take a few days to a week to receive your results. The risk with this is that by then you have potentially isolated unnecessarily or have unknowingly spread the virus to others. The other trouble with a PCR test is that if you have tested positive for COVID-19 recently, the PCR is so sensitive that it will show that you are still positive even after your infectious period.



### **Antigen test Pros:**

Test results can be revealed in as little as 15 minutes



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- You can buy them at a pharmacy to have on hand in your home for convenience
- They are available to schools to help keep kids in school due to close contacts
- They can be used to determine the end of an infectious period if you have already tested positive for COVID-19

### **Antigen test Cons:**

 They are not sensitive enough to be very accurate in the early stages of the virus

The Antigen test is what schools use for "Test at Home" or what you buy over the counter at the pharmacy. Antigen tests detect specific proteins on the surface of the coronavirus. They are sometimes referred to as rapid diagnostic tests because you have your results in as little as 15 minutes. This test is fairly accurate but is best used when someone is showing symptoms of COVID-19. The rapid antigen test is what you should be taking after you have had Covid-19 for several days and want to confirm you're no longer infectious.

IMPORTANT: In asymptomatic people with recent known or suspected exposure that suggest no current evidence of infection, the ANTIGEN results represent a snapshot of the time around specimen collection and could change if tested again in one or more days.

This is how we are using Test to Stay these days...

If your child comes to the Nurse's Office during the school day and is experiences symptoms that could be covid related, Mrs. Mayer will assess the situation. If she feels it could be helpful, and you have signed the Test to

Stay consent and registration, SHE WILL CALL HOME and ask if you would like her to administer an antigen test. In MOST cases, the student will still be sent home (because they are not feeling well) and an additional antigen test will be sent home in their backpack for you to administer at home 24 hours later. It is an optional tool we can use to help kids stay in school or get back to school quicker when they are not feeling well.
