### SBAC Testing

We will have our students in grades 3-6 take part one of the SBAC math assessment on April 5th and April 6th. Part one is made up of multiple choice questions. The second part of the math assessment are performance tasks, which will take place on April 7th.

The ELA assessment will take place on April 11th, 12th, 13th and 14th. The first two days will be multiple choice questions, day 3 will be short answers, and on the 4th day your child will need to write a longer essay.

Please make sure your child has eaten breakfast and is well rested. It would be beneficial to have your child take the test with their class so please try to send your child to school on all the above dates on time. Please let me know if you have any questions or concerns with having your child attend school for this state assessment.



#### **Bus Tickets**

We have been seeing an increase in student behavior on the buses. It is a privilege to have your child ride the bus and we expect our students to be respectful to all people on the bus at all times and to listen to the bus driver's directions. Please take the time to review these expectations with your child. If your child is not

safe or following the rules the bus driver will write them a ticket.

If your child receives a ticket please sign and return it to school the next morning. The bus drivers need to have the return ticket signed before your child returns on the bus. Each ticket is put into a discipline referral form and the number of tickets are tracked. If your child receives 2 tickets they will be off the bus. If your child receives more than 3 tickets, they may be removed from the bus for 30 days.

Please encourage your child to make good choices. It is important that the bus is safe for all students and adults.

It's a fun day to wear your unicorn clothing, make some brightly colored pancakes or cupcakes and decorate them with multicolored sprinkles or glitter.




United Counseling Service (UCS) will be presenting a virtual screening of the Indieflix documentary, LIKE on Wednesday, April 6 at 6pm.


