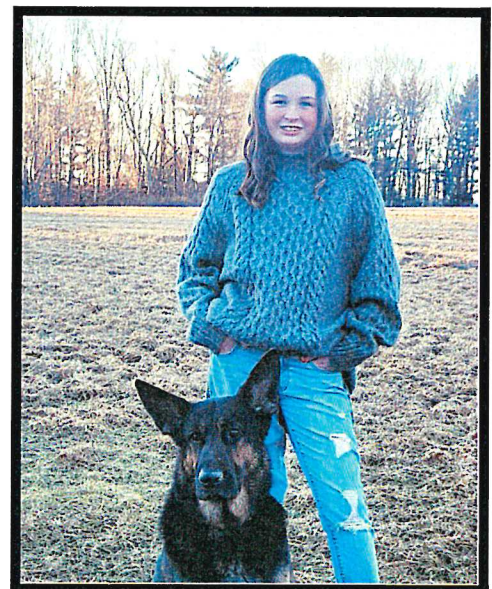
"My favorite Mettawee memory was Mrs. Lea giving us candy and 6th grade science."

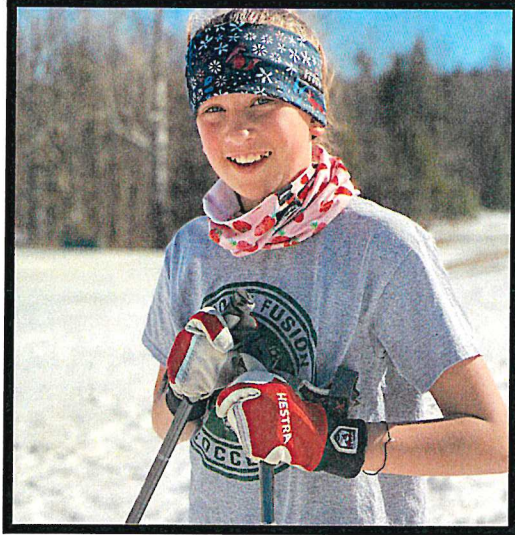

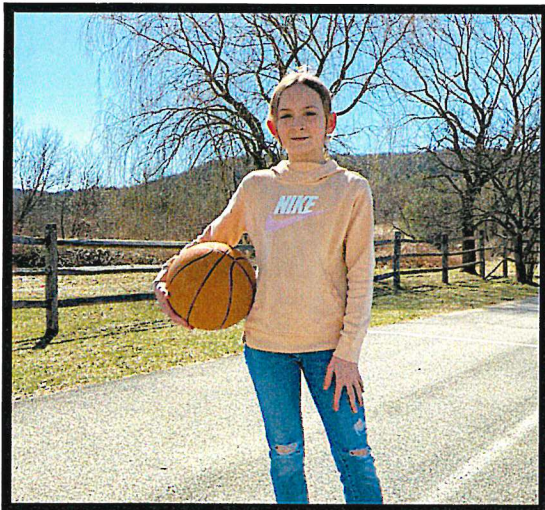

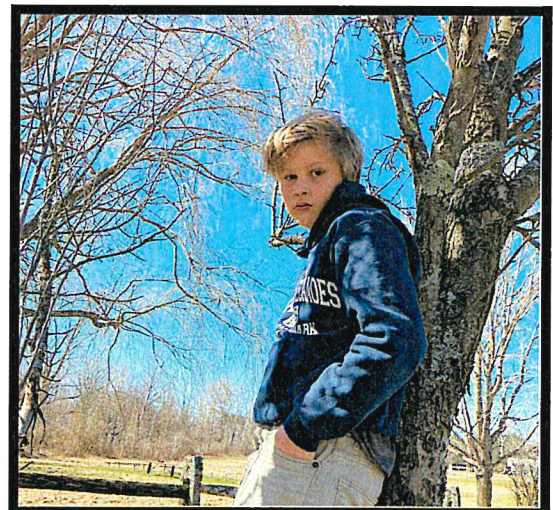
