#### WEEKLY COMMUNICATION

For those of you who are new to Mettawee, we send out weekly communication on Thursdays in the form of an email called the Mettawee Messenger. This communication goes to parents, students, and staff. Most weeks, a communication folder called our Big Blue Folder will go home on a Thursday in your child's backpack. You should be in the practice of checking your child's backpack every Thursday to be sure we have not sent paper communication home. In an effort to reduce paper we will send home flyers and things of that nature one per family and you will find it in your oldest child's folder. Most often, the folder is only sent home when there is information that needs to be filled out and returned to school. For instance - your child will have a Big Blue Folder this week filled with beginning of school year emergency paperwork. We try to let you know in the electronic Messenger that you should look in their bag for a folder on the weeks that we put one together. It is very important that you READ the weekly communication so that you will know what is going on. Following this electronic newsletter each week will be flyers, community



information, forms, and upcoming happenings.

THIS WEEK: ALL forms, the lunch menu, health guidance from Mrs. Mayer, and a new bus note pad will be in your Big Blue folder.

Electronic communication: Your Mettawee Messenger will be sent in multiple emails since there is so much information going home. This will help you to search the important information if you ever need access to it again. The main Mettawee Messenger email will be the newsletter, a letter from Mrs. DeBonis, flyers and general information. There will also be an email for Food Services with your menu, free and reduced lunch application, and a letter from Food Services. All forms that need to be filled out and returned will be sent in a separate email but also provided in hard copy in your Big Blue folder so you won't need to print any of them. The last email will be the After School Program (MAP) Handbook and registration form.



Please find in your Big Blue folder a letter regarding health and safety from

Mrs. Mayer.

Following the letter

is a chart explaining protocols for this school year; when to keep your child home, testing for Covid, what to do if you test positive for Covid, exposures to Covid, and face coverings. Most importantly, please do not send your child to school if they are not feeling well. We thank you for your continued support.

This fall each classroom teacher will be inviting you to a meeting with other parents so you will learn about the classroom's curriculum, daily schedule,

homework, and classroom expectations. These meetings are scheduled for the evening of **Tuesday, September 6th for grades K through 6.** On the evening of September 6th, grades K, 1, & 6 will meet at 5:30 p.m., grades 2 & 3 will meet at 6:00 p.m., and grades 4, 4/5, and 5 will meet at 6:30 p.m. We hope that every parent will be able to attend these meetings. We will provide childcare for your school-age child in our library both evenings.

## Drop-Off, Tardies, Dismissal, & Early Pickups

Our school day begins at 7:40 outside at the flag pole for a community greeting and song.

Drop off will run from 7:30-8:00 each morning.

- We are hoping to keep the drop off procedure safe and smooth for everyone.
- Car drop off will be in the front of the school using the drop off lane.
- All students PK-6 will enter through the main entrance door.
- Please do not drop off your child before 7:30

Your child will be considered tardy after 8:00.

 Tardy students will need to be brought to the main entrance of the school. Please ring the doorbell and wait outside until a staff member lets you in. Your child must sign in at the front desk if they arrive tardy.

**Dismissal** is at 2:30 each afternoon and parents are required to pick up their students before 2:50.

- There will be no after school childcare the first few days of school. After School Program begins September 6th.
- Parents who pick their child up early must ring the doorbell, properly identify themselves, and wait until we have your child ready for you.

Parents who are visiting must be here for a set purpose like volunteering in a classroom or being present for All-School Meeting. Any deliveries of shoes or lunch boxes will be handled by front desk staff.

Please make sure all pickup permissions are updated with the school. If we do not have permission, we cannot dismiss the student to a non-custodial adult.

If you have a change of dismissal plans for your child, please call the school before 2:00 PM.

#### After School Program

We are excited to offer an After School Program again this year for our Kindergarten through 6th grade students. You will sometimes hear or see the After School Program referred to as MAP (Mettawee After School Program).

In your oldest child's Big Blue folder you will find a Handbook that should answer most of your questions regarding the After School Program. You will also find a registration form for each of your children—it is important that each child have their own registration form. The Mettawee After School Program will begin on September 6th. This allows our instructor time to organize the paperwork and fully staff the program based on how many families are in need of after school care. IMPORTANT: your child can not stay for the After School Program if they do not have a registration form on file.



#### Extra Clothing

Please be sure you are packing extra clothing in your child's backpack. We will be going outside as often as possible – sometimes rain or shine – for learning, brain breaks, and exercise. It is important that your child has an extra set of clothing in case they get wet and need to change.


