

BIKE WEEK RETURNS


We are excited to announce that the Bike



Bromley Outing Club – JISP "Ski 5" Program 2022/23

New for the 2022/23 ski season, we are testing a pilot program to include your 5-year-old kindergarten students who are enrolled in participating JISP program schools. We are excited to be able to offer an introduction to the JISP program for those youngest students that cannot yet participate in the KAP program. This pilot program is contingent upon having enough parent volunteers available to supervise a group of their students each week for their lesson period (1:00-3:00pm). If you are interested in organizing this "Ski 5" program at your school, please reach out to the Bromley Outing Club office via email at boc@bromleyoutingclub.com to get started. We need one volunteer to act as the lead coordinator for your group who will be responsible for recruiting and coordinating volunteers for this program. Volunteers for this pilot program will go through BOC instructor training and will join our volunteer program where they can earn lift tickets in exchange for their service. Lift riding will be restricted to the Magic Carpet for student participants with exception only being made based upon the number of volunteers present, specific to this group, on any given lesson day.
