

#### Health Notice from the BRSU School Nurses

11/10/2022

Dear BRSU Families and Staff,

The upcoming months bring colder weather, shorter days and more time indoors, which leads to a seasonal increase in viral illness. In the interest of planning ahead for Thanksgiving and other upcoming holidays, it is important to do our best now to reduce the spread of illness in our schools. The goal is to reduce transmission of viruses as much as possible so we can be healthy when it comes time for travel and family gatherings (and also holiday school events!).

This is probably one of the most important times of year to take symptoms seriously and keep children home when they begin feeling sick because it could help prevent outbreaks of illnesses such as the Flu, Covid and RSV, all of which are beginning to increase now. The same guidance is important for adults in our buildings as well. This way, we can ALL have a healthier winter.

If your child has symptoms of illness in the morning, please keep them home from school. Colds and flu are highly contagious in the earlier days of illness. If you are unsure what is the best decision to make, please call your school nurse in the morning and talk it through together before sending your child to school and possibly exposing others. Your school nurse can also partner with you in deciding when your child should return to school after illness.

Healthier school buildings with fewer circulating illnesses means that as many people as possible can be healthy for the holidays.

Flu and Covid shots are available now, and are known to reduce the spread of these illnesses as well as decrease severity of symptoms, especially for our elderly relatives, young children and family members with weaker immune symptoms or chronic illness. You can arrange getting vaccines with your healthcare provider.

Mask wearing, while optional, remains a helpful tool for anyone who wishes to reduce the risk of passing germs in public places as well. Reviewing proper cough etiquette ("cover your cough") and thorough handwashing also go a long way as we make every effort to not share our germs.

We cannot thank you enough for joining us in thinking ahead and taking proactive steps to stop viruses from spreading. This is truly a community-wide effort that only works if we all do our part!

### November 8, 2022 Merck Forest Field and Forest Fridays: Grades 5 & 6

Dear Parents,

Merck Forest and Farmland Center is once again offering 'Field and Forest Fridays' for students at the Mettawee Community School in Kindergarten through 4th grade. And, due to interest in this program for Grades K – 4, we are extending this program to include students in grades 5 and 6.

Offered at no cost, all students will need is their warm outdoor winter recess clothes and a desire to have fun outside (as well as an afternoon snack and water bottle). Our goal is to offer an outdoor experience that is as fun, safe, and comfortable as possible and empower students with a skillset they can take home.

The Merck Field and Forest Friday program will include:

- Woodcraft: Staying safe in the woods, shelter building, survival skills for the outof-doors
- o Games and Activities
- Snowshoeing and Sledding
- Nature Ecology and Exploration: Winter Bird ID, winter tree ID, animal tracking

Merck Forest staff members will lead the fun and exploration as we get out and play in the fields and forest surrounding the school. The program will begin January 6<sup>th</sup> and take place Friday afternoons from January 13 until March 10, following the JISP schedule. Each Field and Forest Friday will begin at the 11:40 a.m. dismissal on Fridays and end at 3:00 p.m. with parent pick-up at the Mettawee Community School lobby. Dates for Field and Forest Fridays are as following: Jan. 13, 20, & 27; Feb. 3 & 10; and Mar. 3 & 10.

A minimum number of students enrolled will be required for the program to run.

Please return your sign-up sheet to your child's teacher **no later than November 18th**. Enrollment will be on a first-come, first-serve basis. We look forward to having your child join us for Field and Forest Friday!





