## All School Play Returns

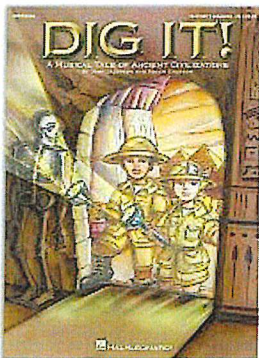
Our students will once again grace the stage as we perform our All-School Play,

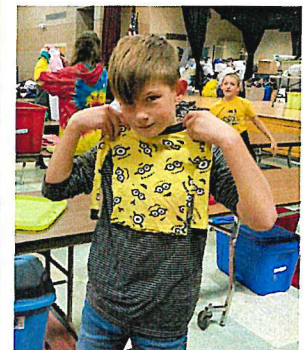
Please ask your students to share their song with you so they can practice and encourage them to read through lines with you if they have a speaking part. The play is only 14 DAYS AWAY!!!

Dear Parents/Guardians,

As part of our ongoing efforts to keep our learning community safe, this year BRSU Schools (Currier Memorial School, The Dorset School, Flood Brook School, Manchester Elementary Middle School, Mettawee Community School and Sunderland Elementary School) will be adopting a new protocol for responding to an active threat in our schools. At the recommendation of the Vermont School Safety Center, Vermont's Agency of Education and Department of Public Safety and the U.S Department of Homeland Security, we will begin the transition to what is known as an "options based" response protocol for addressing the unlikely event of an active threat in our schools. An options-based protocol empowers people to choose a response to an active threat situation based on the information they have in the moment, known as situational awareness. It teaches individuals to use the information at their disposal to do what they think is best to keep themselves and others safe.

This fall, our teachers and staff are learning about the options based protocol, "Run / Hide / Fight." The training consists of facilitated group discussions about the protocol and how to apply it to various scenarios. We feel strongly that while older students are aware of the possibility of school violence and can benefit from this training as an important life skill, younger students need only be instructed, as they do now, to follow the direction of their teacher as quickly and quietly as possible. Therefore, in our schools which only serve students through 8th grade, these facilitated discussions will involve adults only and will take place during staff professional development time. Though PreK-8 students will participate in the regular and required drills throughout the year, for now, these drills will look and feel the same as in previous years.

School violence is not something anyone wants to think about, but in today's world we must do the best we can to be prepared. Thank you for your support in this effort and continue to look for further communications from us in the next few weeks.

# MCT AUDITION NOTICE for "Hansel & Gretel"

Dear Parents and Guardians,

The Dorset Players are delighted to once again host Missoula Children's Theatre. The 2023 Missoula Children's Theatre production will be ***Hansel & Gretel***.

Auditions will be held on Monday, January 16<sup>th</sup> from 4:00 to 6:00 p.m. at the Dorset Playhouse. There are roles for students in Kindergarten through 12<sup>th</sup> grade. Approximately 50-60 local students will be cast to appear in the show with a MCT Tour Actor/Director. There is no guarantee that everyone who auditions will be cast in the play. **Students wishing to audition must arrive by the scheduled starting time and stay for the entire two-hour session.** (The first rehearsal begins approximately 30 minutes after the audition for the older cast members.)

This is a group audition - **no advance preparation is necessary**, but a smile never hurts. Students should just be ready to come and have a good time!

Rehearsals will be conducted on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday from 4:00-6:00 and/or 6:30-8:30 at the Dorset Playhouse. Although not all cast members will be needed at every session, those auditioning must have a clear schedule for the entire week and if selected, be able to attend all rehearsals required for their role. A detailed rehearsal schedule will be distributed at the conclusion of the audition. Cast members scheduled for the full 4½ hours of rehearsal will be asked to bring a sack dinner or snack.

The performances will be held on Saturday, January 21<sup>st</sup> at 2:00 and 7:00 and will be presented at the Dorset Playhouse. All those cast must be available for **all** scheduled performances.

The Missoula Children's Theatre is a non-profit organization based in Missoula, Montana. The residency in Dorset is made possible by the Dorset Players with help from community businesses and members. To cover ever-increasing production costs not covered by our sponsors, there will be a fee of \$25.00 for each child who agrees to participate in this show. **We are asking that parents make payment of the \$25.00 on Monday evening after the cast assignments have been made.** Should this fee pose a financial hardship, please talk to one of Players' Producers about the availability of a scholarship.

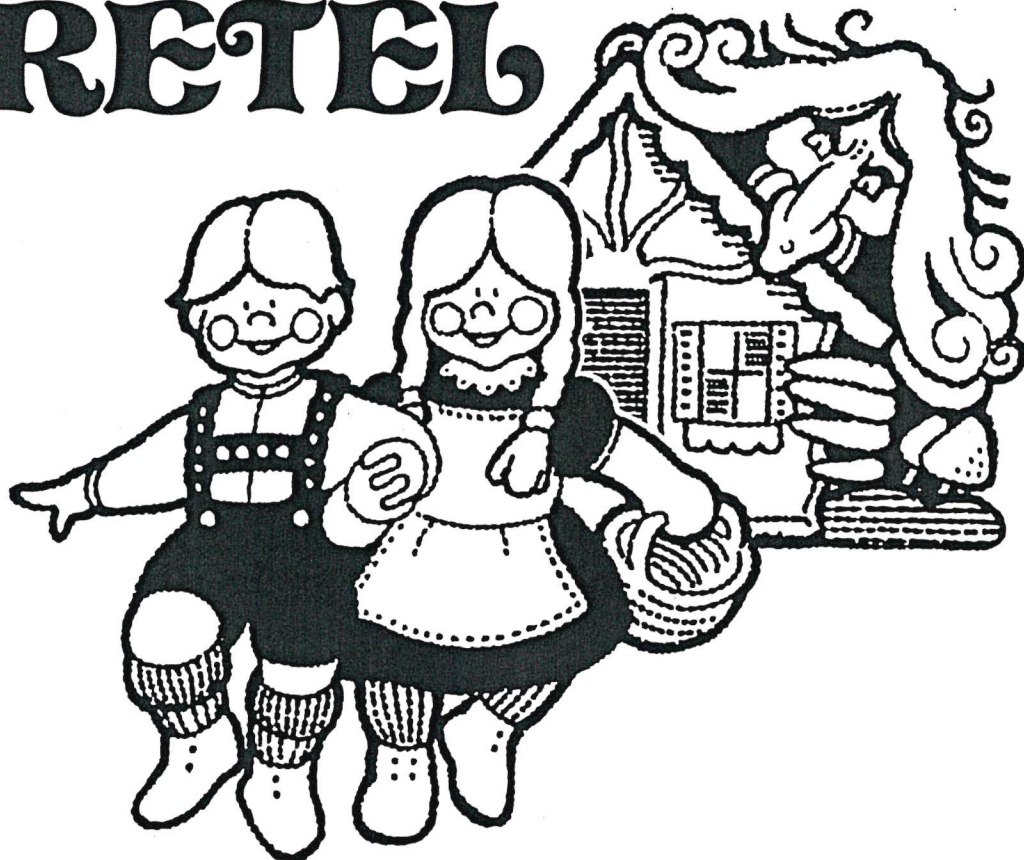

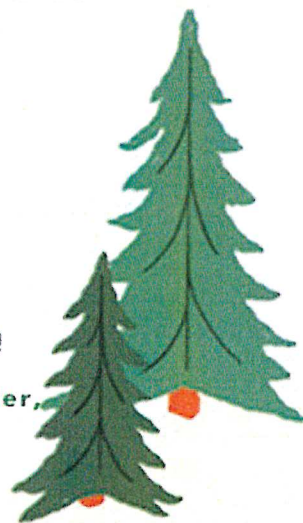

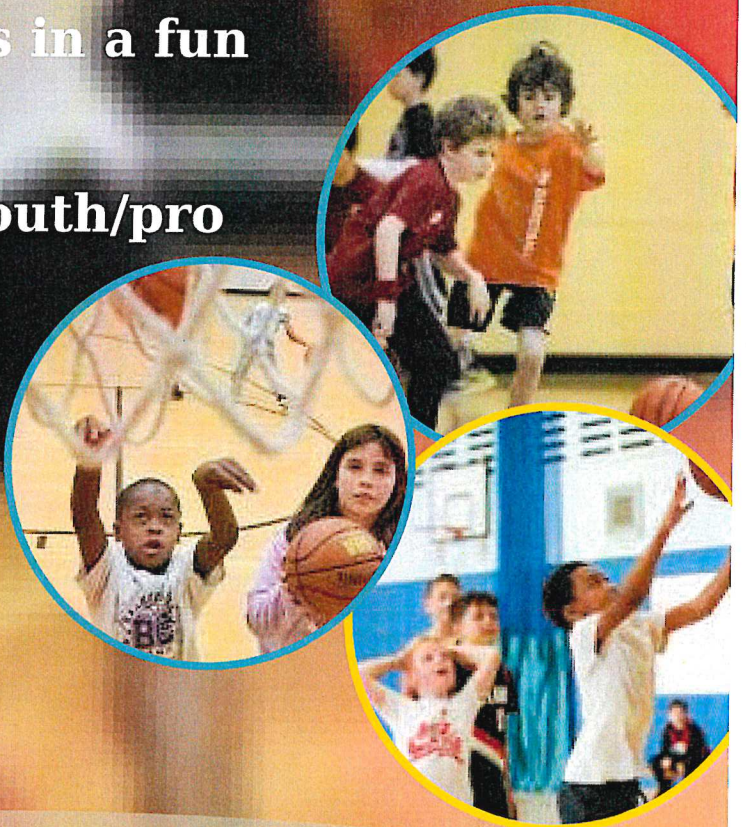
