Principal's Corner:

Pokemon Cards

It has been brought to my attention that the Pokemon cards are becoming an issue in school and on the bus. We know that students are excited to talk about their Pokemon cards with their peers. We want to allow students this opportunity to talk about their cards since this brings them joy, but we are concerned that students are now trading the cards with each other. This becomes a huge problem since the cards are worth different amounts of money. In addition, students get upset with the trading decisions and would like to trade back the cards. The teachers, staff, and bus drivers are hearing conflicts with the Pokemon cards. I want to set clear expectations that we will not allow any trading of the Pokemon cards and they cannot be out on the bus. Students can discuss the cards

at appropriate times during the school day. I am hoping that we can continue to allow Pokemon cards in school as long as there is no trading between the students. Thank you for your cooperation.

ILLNESS REMINDER


As we kick off the 2023 portion of our school year we wanted to remind you that hand washing and staying home when you are not feeling well are the best ways to reduce the amount of germs in our building

Missoula Children's Theatre holds auditions for Hansel and Gretel at the Dorset Playhouse






