The Stratton Community Foundation sponsored these dental screenings, fluoride application, and the opportunity for Amy to teach our students the importance of brushing and flossing. We are so fortunate to have this service come to our school.

### VT State Assessments in May

This year the State of Vermont has shifted the vendor for the statewide assessment system from the Smarter Balanced Assessment Consortium (SBAC) to Cognia and has begun referring to the assessments (ELA, Math, Science, and Alternative Assessment) as the Vermont Comprehensive Assessment Program (VTCAP). This spring 3rd-6th graders throughout Vermont will participate in the Vermont (VTCAP). At Mettawee we have reserved May 2nd-4th for English Language Art (ELA) and May 9th-10th for the Math assessment. We are hoping that you can have your child go to bed early so they are well rested and prepared for these assessments. It is also important to make sure your



child is at school on these testing days. If you have any questions, please feel free to reach out to Brooke DeBonis.

Dear Household,

This year, all students at schools offering universal meals through CEP and Provision 2 are eligible for the \$120 Summer P-EBT benefit, if they are enrolled in May 2023. All public schools in Vermont are participating in CEP and Provision 2 this year, along with many independent schools. This means that all students at these schools will be eligible for the \$120 Summer P-EBT benefit.

Vermont will be issuing a final round of Pandemic EBT (P-EBT) benefits for Summer 2023. All students at our school qualify for a Summer P-EBT benefit of \$120 per student. This is because of the way that we are offering free school meals to all students this year.

The benefit will be sent to the head of household and mailing address that we have on file for your student. If you have moved or need to update the head of household, please let us know by Friday May 5th. To make changes, please contact your school's office.

These benefits will be sent out by mid-August. If your student missed school for a COVID-related reason between February 2023 and May 11, 2023, you will receive benefits for those days at the same time.




